## Application for Deferred Disposition

Deferred Disposition is a suspended sentence (probation). On your plea of guilty or no contest, the Judge will defer the finding of guilt until a later date, assess the applicable fees, and order you to comply with certain conditions. If you successfully comply with the terms, your case will be dismissed.

However, if you fail to comply with terms and conditions of Deferred Disposition a guilty judgment may be imposed and a conviction may be reported to the Texas Department of Public Safety in accordance with Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Art. 27.14(c).

You may apply for Deferred Disposition for ONE offense via mail, or in person by submitting the application on or before your court date. The Judge will review your application and Deferred Disposition will only be granted at the discretion of the reviewing Judge.

Deferred Disposition requests will **not** be accepted for the following.

- Speeding over 25 miles or more over the posted speed limit or in excess of 95 mph
- Defendants that hold of CDL (Commercial Driver's License)
- Violation for passing a school bus
- Any traffic violation that occurred in a construction zone with workers present
- Juvenile cases (must appear in person with parent or guardian)
- Alcohol/Tobacco/Assault cases (must appear in open court)

Defendants who are younger than 25 years of age at the time of the alleged offense must also complete a Driver Safety Course in addition to complying with the terms of deferred disposition, the court requires you to bring back a DSC certificate on or before the end of the deferral period.

I hereby enter a plea of  Guilty  No Contest (check one) to the violation of \_\_\_\_\_ and waive my right to a jury trial or a trial before the court, and waive my right to Discovery under Art. 39.14 TCCP and request Deferred Disposition. I understand that if I successfully complete the terms of the Deferred Disposition in a timely manner, my case will be dismissed. If I do not successfully complete the terms of the Deferred Disposition, a notice to appear in court will be sent to show cause why I did not complete the terms of Deferred Disposition as ordered. Furthermore, I understand that if I do not show sufficient cause, the Deferred Disposition will be revoked and a judgment of guilty entered and may be reported to the Texas Department of Public Safety in accordance with Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Art. 27.14(c). I understand I have a duty to inform the court of any change in my address or phone number.
